



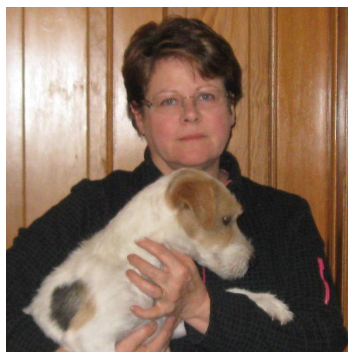

Jack Approved

Hol-EE Mol-EE Extreme Dog Toy - is a TOUGH, rubber ball designed to withstand the most demanding of dogs. Made from 100% natural rubber, it measures 5" in diameter.

The soft texture has great mouth feel and the rubber gives it durability and a super bounce. While not intended for use as a chew toy, the angular design makes it very difficult for a dog to get good mouth position for extended gnawing.

Jack Snacks

Dog Treats

1 can sardines packed in oil or water, undrained *1/4 c canola or olive oil*
1/2 c. water (if the dough is to dry, I add a little more) *3/4 c cornmeal*
2 c. whole wheat flour (I used white flour)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

In a food processor, combine undrained sardines, water & oil. blend until smooth.

Add flour & cornmeal. Blend until mixture is crumbly.

Turn out onto the counter & mix with your hands until dough is soft.

Roll dough into walnut sized balls & place on an ungreased cookie sheet.

Press each one down with the back of a floured fork, like a peanut butter cookie.

Bake 15-20 min until firm. If you want a firmer cookie, turn the oven off & leave them in the oven to cool down. (Store in airtight containers or freeze)

Enjoy. They break into small pieces that don't crumble, so are great for a real high value training treat.
