



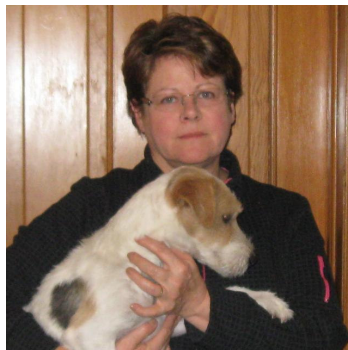

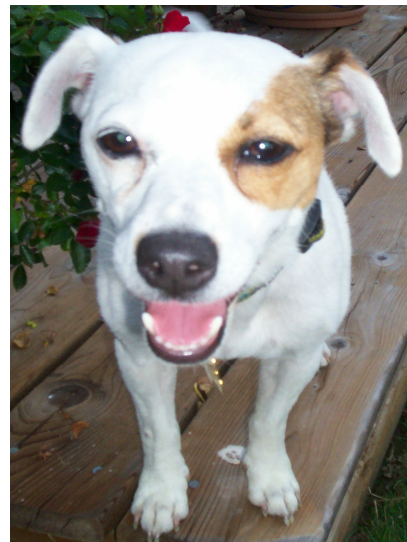

Jack Snacks

Nutty Mutty Chewies

3/4 c unsweetened applesauce 1/4 c peanut butter 1/2c chopped peanuts
1/2c honey 1 egg 1 1/4 c white flour 1 c whole wheat flour
2 tsp baking soda 1 tsp ginger 1 tsp cinnamon 1/2 tsp ground cloves

Preheat oven to 350. Mix together applesauce, peanut butter, honey and egg in bowl. In another bowl, combine flour, baking soda, and spices. Then stir into the applesauce mixture. Drop onto a greased baking sheet. Sprinkle with chopped peanuts and pat down with your hand. Bake 8-10 minutes.

(makes 25 cookies)
